- Free of charge consultation of standards at ILNAS premises (eLibrary)





Standards and standardization: definition

What is a standard and what use is it?

A document established by consensus and approved by a recognized body that provides for common and repeated use, rules, guidelines or characteristics for activities or their results, aimed at the achievement of the optimum degree of order in a given context

What is standardization?

Standardization is an activity VOLUNTARY CONSENSUS-based and conducted by interested parties and for themselves, in a spirit of openness and transparency in organizations of independent and recognized standards, leading to the adoption of standards with which compliance is done on a voluntary basis.





Drafting European and International Standards

How to make a standard? Considerations

- 1 Who can propose a new standard?
 - > Everyone
- 2 Who writes the standard?
 - Volunteer experts within technical committees
- 3 Who provides support help?
 - National Standards Bodies





What are the benefits of using standards?

Standards facilitate trade

- Allowing a codification of knowledge
- Constituting an international language

Standards promote transparency and ethics

- Establishing trust between the partners
- Reassuring customers about quality, compatibility, performance announced products and services

Standards are a source of competitiveness

- Reflecting the state of the art
- Promoting the diffusion of innovations
- To develop a new market while benefiting from references widely recognized by all stakeholders

Standards assess quality and risk management evaluation

- Guaranteeing a certain level of quality products and services, consistent over time and regardless of the geographic area
- Allowing risk and safety management






ISO standards development process (www.iso.org)
