Goals

- > Support the national economy in terms of competitiveness, performance and international visibility
- Develop a homogeneous "standardization culture" at national level
- Improve the position of Luxembourg in the European and international standardization organizations
- Launch an innovative and federative way for the national standardization process

Foundations

- Pillar I: A sector-based normative approach as a support for the national economy
- > Pillar II: Innovation and research development in the frame of standardization
- Pillar III: A sector-based development of the National Standardization Organization (OLN)
- Pillar IV: Standardization training and public awareness
- Pillar V: The establishment and development of the Economic Interest Grouping "Agency for Standardization and Knowledge-based Economy"






Implementation

The standardization strategy 2010-2020 is based on:

- > EU 2020 Strategy and coalition agreement for government 2009-2014
- Economic approach based on the real needs identified per sector
- Guiding principle: "Setting standards means setting the market"
- Knowledge triangle



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Observation after 2 years (End of 2012)

- There is virtually no culture of standardization in Luxembourg
- There is a marked lack of interest in some awareness and training activities
- In general, market involvement is weak

Challenges

- Organize standardization at national level
- Measure and evaluate business needs.
- Adapt all useful services on offer

Actions to be carried out

- Develop a homogeneous culture of standardization
- Ensure the growth of various economic sectors in Luxembourg from a standard-setting perspective

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


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(Inter-) sectoral standardization approach

- Support "promising" sectors of economic activity
- Study: standards-related monitoring and analysis
- Awareness campaign: consultative committee, fora, working groups
- Training
- Research: scientific articles, applied PhD studies

European research projects

- Including standardization in FP7 projects
- Importance of standardization mentioned in "Horizon 2020"



Actions

- Draw up a standardization research strategy
- Manage the global standardization research program
- Draft research, development and innovation projects
- Participate in research, development and innovation projects
- Develop research partnerships
- Transfer of the results from research, development and innovation projects
- Monitor PhD thesis subjects
- Participate in scientific publications

- Measurement of the economic benefit of standardization
